AUTHORS GUIDELINES

We request authors to follow the APA (7th Edition) referencing style.

1. The full length of the article should be between 3000-4000 words (including abstract and references).
2. The article should be typed in Times New Roman, 12 point, 1.5 line spacing.
3. Use British "-ise" spellings (labour, centre, organise).
4. For notes, use Times New Roman, 11 point, single line spacing.

5. Use double quotation marks for quotations, and single marks for quotations within quotations.
6. Use italics for non-English words and phrases.
7. Each citation should be in the reference list and vice-versa.
8. Works cited in the text should be like - **(Baruah 1999: 20-24); (Saikia 2023: 345)**.
9. For repeat citations: **(ibid 15)**
10. For groups of citations, order alphabetically and not chronologically, using a semi-colon to separate names: **(Baruah 2020; Dutta 2020)**.
11. Figures and tables should be cited in the text with adequate/full source.
12. Tables should be provided in editable format. Both tables and figures should be referred to in the text by number separately (e.g., Table 1).
